The History of AIROS

1992-1993

NAPT creates the first satellite network for native radio, American Indian Radio on Satellite (AIROS).

1993

Native America Calling (NAC), radio's first national live all-native talk show debuts on AIROS.

1996

AlterNative Voices makes its debut on AIROS.

1997

AIROS starts streaming live over the Internet. *Native*Sounds - Native Voices
debuts.

Simulcast the Toronto Internet Powwow, and Indian Living

1998

AIROS goes 24/7.

Earthsongs debuts and the 1st Annual Nammy Awards are broadcast/webcast.

1999

Voices from the Circle and Club Red with Charlie Hill debut.

2000

AIROS broadcasts/webcast live from the Gathering of Nations.

2003

AIROS.ORG surpasses a half million website hits.

2004

AIROS partners with Aboriginal Voices Radio to simulcast the Toronto International Powwow, and American Indian Living debuts.

2005

UnderCurrents, a new music service, debuts.









AIROS (American Indian Radio on Satellite) is a distributor of Native American programs, providing station affiliates and their listeners with authentic Native American music, news, entertainment, interviews and discussions of the current issues in Indian Country.

Programming:

Native America Calling, the AIROS flagship program, is a LIVE one-hour call-in show, now distributed to over 40 Native and non-Native radio stations across Indian Country, Monday-Friday at 1:00PM ET.

American Indian Living, a one-hour radio talk show focusing on health issues in Indian country, broadcasts Tuesdays at 5:00PM ET on the American Indian Radio on Satellite (AIROS) Network. It originates from Oklahoma and Tennessee.

Earthsongs is a modern mix of today's Native artists who are setting new directions in music. Host Gregg McVicar (Tlingit) artfully presents tracks that range from unadorned solo acoustic performances to blistering blues, punk, hip hop and techno.

Native Sounds-Native Voices is a music service featuring traditional and contemporary Native American music. NS-NV is produced in two formats, the National Edition with host/producer John Gregg, Sr. (Hopi/Inupiat) and the Regional Edition with producers from across North America.

Voices from the Circle highlights Native news, music, issues, entertainment and storytelling from reservations and urban communities. The weekly program is produced and hosted by Barbara Jersey (Menominee/Potawatomi) and Jim DeNomie (Bad River Chippewa).

AlterNative Voices features Native music, interviews, and news reports relevant to Indian Country. AlterNative Voices is produced and hosted by Z. Susanne Aikman (Eastern Band Cherokee) and originates from KUVO in Denver.

UnderCurrents is a music service featuring a free-flowing music mix of rock, blues, roots, reggae, electronica and world hosted by Gregg McVicar (Tlingit).
